We are pleased to announce that continuing last year, we are going to hold the "World Kidney Program 2023" from March 1 on Wednesday to March 31 on Friday, 2023 for the general public, in support of the purpose of "World Kidney Day"— early detection and prevention of kidney disease, which is the second Thursday of March every year as designated by ISN (International Society of Nephrology) and IFKF (International Federation of Kidney Foundations). Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) is a disease in which kidney function declines and kidney abnormalities such as proteinuria persist. It is characterized by a few symptoms in the early stages and is difficult to be aware of. If unnoticed and the disease condition progresses, the risk of needing dialysis treatment or a kidney transplantation or developing heart disease or stroke is said to increase. The theme of this program is "Know Your Kidneys, Save Your Kidneys", and we hope that the public can learn about kidney disease and dialysis treatment during this one-month program.
